#It will be exempted if the applicant is a M.D. or a registered Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) doctor.

Coach Certification level	Requirements	Responsibilities
Accredited Master Community Coach	At least 8 years as a Senior Coach	Responsible for Senior and or Junior coaches under his/her leadership. Can be tasked with the Mentoring of an Apprentice Coach.
Accredited Senior Community Coach	At least 4 years as a Junior Coach	Can have a club and run recreational and competitive programs. Responsible for Junior coaches under his/her leadership.
Accredited Junior Community Coach	At least 2 years as an Apprentice Coach	Can assist a Senior Coach with a club and running recreational programs.
Accredited Apprentice Community Coach	Must be mentored by a Master Coach for no less than 2 years	Is being mentored by a Master Coach.

Accredited Apprentice Community Coach

Must be a Wushu Canada Level 5 Member minimum.

18 years of age and above.

Criminal Check (Required every 4 years) from the local Police or through Wushu Canada (<https://www.mybackcheck.com/Public/Login.aspx>).

Eligibility Criteria: See above table. Master Coach's confirmation required.

Membership Payment Options:

Option 1: Apprentice Coach Membership fee of \$50.00 (good for one year) includes certificate.

Provide 2 Passport size photos.

Accredited Junior Community Coach

Must be a Wushu Canada Level 6 Member minimum.

18 years of age and above.

Criminal Check (Required every 4 years) from the local Police or through Wushu Canada (<https://www.mybackcheck.com/Public/Login.aspx>).

Eligibility Criteria: See above table. Master Coach's confirmation required.

Membership Payment Options:

Option 1: Level 6 Coach Membership fee of \$50.00 (good for one year) includes certificate.

Option 2: Level 6 Coach Membership fee of \$300.00 (for lifetime) includes certificate, optional wallet badge add \$50.00.

Option 3. 65 years old and over: \$10 for Lifetime includes certificate, optional wallet badge add \$50.00.

Provide 2 Passport size photos.

Accredited Senior Community Coach

Must be a Wushu Canada Level 7 Member minimum.

18 years of age and above.

Standard First Aid Course or CPR Certification.

Criminal Check (Required every 4 years) from the local Police or through Wushu Canada. (<https://www.mybackcheck.com/Public/Login.aspx>).

Eligibility Criteria: See above table. Senior Coach's confirmation required.

Membership Payment Options:

Option 1: Level 7 Coach Membership fee of \$50.00 (good for one year) includes certificate.

Option 2: Level 7 Coach Membership fee of \$300.00 (for lifetime) includes certificate, optional wallet badge add \$50.00.

Option 3. 65 years old and over: \$10 for Lifetime Membership includes a certificate, optional wallet badge add \$50.00.

Provide 2 Passport size photos.

Accredited Master Community Coach

Must be a Wushu Canada Level 8 Member or 9-10 Honorary Level Member minimum.

18 years of age and above.

Standard First Aid Course or CPR Certification.

Criminal Check (Required every 4 years) from the local Police or through Wushu Canada.
(<https://www.mybackcheck.com/Public/Login.aspx>).

Eligibility Criteria: See above table. Master Coach’s confirmation required.

Membership Payment Options:

Level 8:

Option 1: Level 8 Coach Membership fee of \$50.00 (good for one year) includes certificate.

Option 2: Level 8 Coach Membership fee of \$300.00 (for lifetime) includes certificate, optional wallet badge add \$50.00.

Option 3. 65 years old and over: \$10 for Lifetime Membership includes a certificate, optional wallet badge add \$50.00.

Honorary Level Membership:

Option 1: 9-10 Honorary Level Membership fee of \$50.00 (good for one year) includes certificate.

Option 2: 9-10 Honorary Level Membership fee of \$300.00 (for lifetime) includes a certificate, optional wallet badge add \$50.00.

Option 3: 65 years old and over: \$10 for Lifetime Membership includes a certificate, optional wallet badge add \$50.00.

Provide 2 Passport size photos.

Note: The National Coaching Certification Committee remains the final decision on all Wushu Canada Coaching Certification.

Appendix A:

Wushu Canada Coaching Certification Standards Policy

In order to fall into accordance with Team Canada's Coaching Certification Standards Policy for the protection and benefit of all athletes. Wushu Canada would like to introduce the following Coaching Certification Standards Policy for all coaches representing Canada in all IWUF competitions.

All coaches are required to register under Wushu Canada as a **Certified National Coach**, registration fee is \$200.00 CDN.

In order to qualify coaches must:

- a) Have a National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) transcript proving Level 2 Certification or the equivalent in the new NCCP format to at least NCCP Competition Development status.
See **Exemption A** below.
- b) Must be a registered Coach member of Wushu Canada.
- c) Must be an owner of a school registered under Wushu Canada. See **Exemption B** below.
- d) Must be a Canadian Citizen with a valid Canadian Passport.
- e) Possess a valid CPR or First Aid Certification.
- f) Possess a valid Criminal background check.

Exemption A: May be granted on the premise that the coach plans to advance to full level 3 or Competition Development Certification within 2 years. Exemptions may be applied through the Wushu Canada **Coaches Certification Committee**.

Exemption B: Applicant obtains a written recommendation of a school owner registered under Wushu Canada to prove that he/she has been an assistant coach for a minimum of **three** years or he/she has placed on the medal podium in a past IWUF world Championship.

This new Wushu Canada Coaching Certification Standards Policy has been instituted to apply to all coaches representing Canada in all IWUF competitions. It is important for Wushu Canada to ensure a high quality of coaching at all IWUF competitions in an effort to produce high quality athletes and performances.

Appendix B:

Wushu Canada will issue formal certificates for PSO's at the following rates:

Level 1-Level 5 = \$30.00, (Certificates of level only, does not include registration fees).

Level 6-Level 7 = \$50.00, (Certificates of level only, does not include registration fees).

Attention:

For non - Ontario residents, Registration fees should pay to PSO only not to Wushu Canada.

For Community Coach registration fees in Ontario as indicated above - Please remit a certified cheque or money order payable to Wushu Ontario along with a passport size photo and copies of all requirements indicated above (include Criminal Check/ NCCP Coach Profile Transcript / CPR Certification) and send it to:
